

Expression of Interest – Lived Experience Advisors

We have exciting opportunities for a Lived Experience Advisor within the Policy, Advocacy and Government Relations Team (PAGLE).

At MCM our Lived Experience Advisors work to embed lived and living experience into every part of MCM group. Our advisors also work to share their stories at conferences, through media, and in meetings with politicians. They also share opinions on internal and external policy and help design programs or housing initiatives. The advisors all have an experience of homelessness as young people and work with MCMs PAGLE team to help change the system at a state and federal level. How we define lived experience work is with the help of our advisors;

This role works to:

- Embed the voice of young people with lived experience of interacting with the systems of MCM group (homelessness, family violence, mental health, disability) into policy and advocacy to effect meaningful change.
- Participate in lived experience practice, including providing insight to support the development of new programs and improving existing ones, involvement in research projects and advocacy work (panels, conferences or at meetings).
- Informing communications and broader internal functions, to guide MCM Group approaches.

This role reports to the Lived Experience Team Coordinator.

The role will be a maximum term part-time position for 7.6 hours per week, for 12 months paying above award rate. (Possible extension to 24-month term, subject to funding). The working day is Monday and there may be other opportunities outside the standard working hours which will be negotiated. Applicants located outside of Melbourne are welcomed, and work location can be discussed/negotiated.

We are looking for / Do you fit this criteria:

- Previous lived experience of homelessness
- A previous or current MCM group service user ie: homelessness, family violence, mental health, disability
- Someone not currently employed in another MCM Group service
